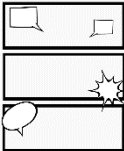


Mon passeport français 5e à la 8e année (#2)

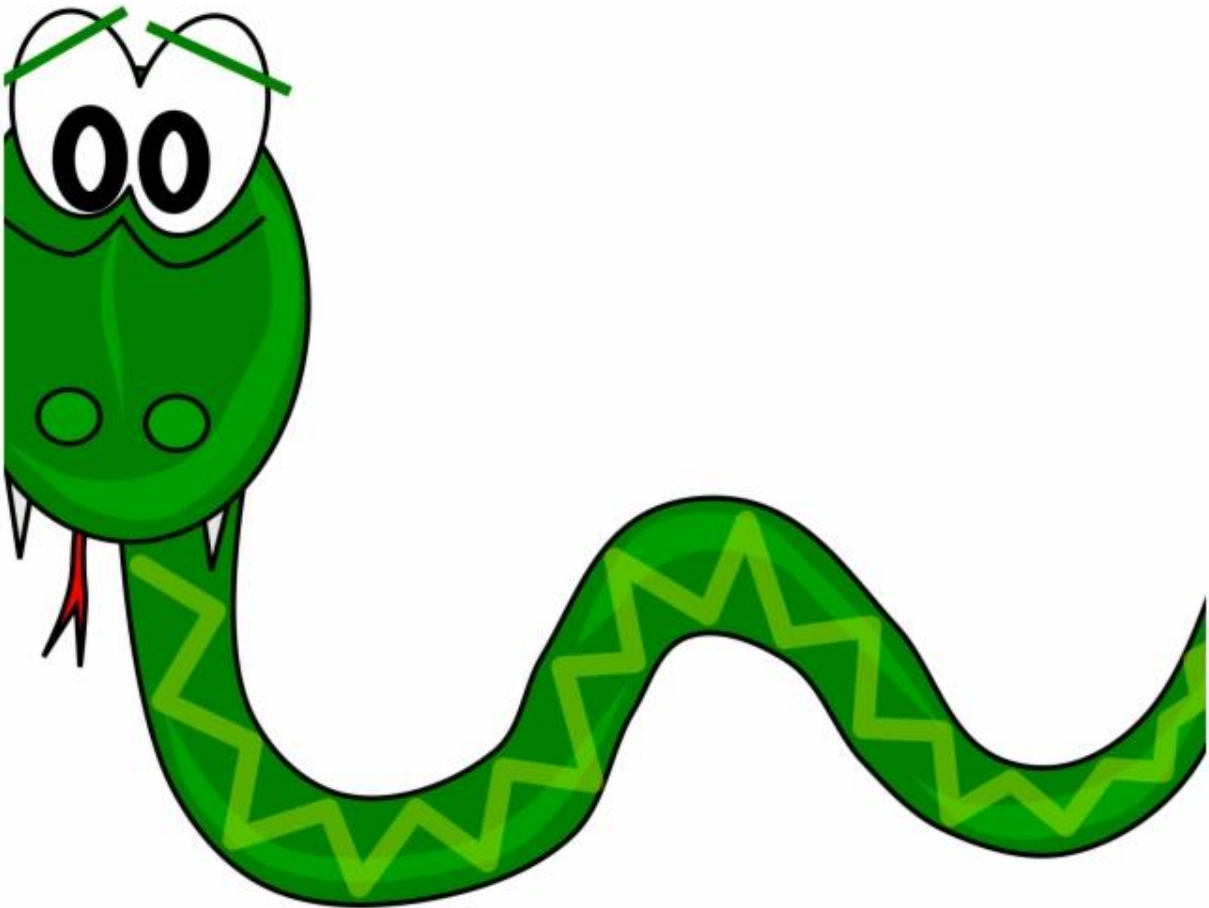

Feeling artsy? See the ideas on the following pages.  Express yourself artistically <i>en français</i>.	Le serpent  In each box, draw a picture of items you know how to say <i>en français</i>. Then, with a sibling or parent, take turns rolling the die and count the number of spaces you get to move. When you land on a square, use the word for that picture in a complete sentence. For example: <i>J’aime les jeux vidéo</i>. Try also using game vocabulary like : <i>C’est mon tour, c’est ton tour, Zut!, j’ai roulé 6..., J’ai gagné! 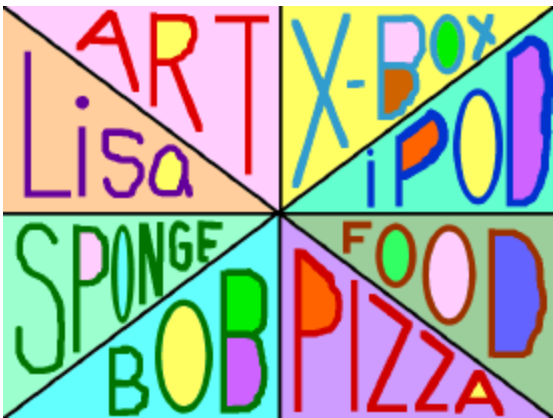
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Kaléidoscope personnel

Matériaux:

- Papier blanc
- Marqueurs, crayons de couleur, pastels
- Règle



Procédure:

Using a ruler, students will divide their paper into eight sections. First, by drawing a line from corner to corner to create an "X" on their paper and then by making a "+" on top of the "X". Next, in each of the eight sections, they will write words of importance to them, such as, friends, family, food, pastimes, animals, weather, seasons, *en français*. Students will use the shape of the section to form the word. For instance, the shape of the section will be a triangle, so they will start from small to large.

Pablo Picasso

Matériaux:

- Papier noir
- Marqueurs, crayons de couleur, pastels, peinture



Procédure:

According to the Cubist style portraits by Pablo Picasso, students create their own self-portraits. Students draw on black paper (any dark color will work) - dividing the face to show multiple views and fracturing into shapes. Students colour their portraits with a limited color plan using pastels.



Image miroir

Matériaux:

- Papier blanc
- Marqueurs, crayons de couleur, pastels, crayon

Procédure:

The student will create a self-portrait while observing himself in a mirror and reflect what he sees onto paper.

The student will then describe his physical appearance orally to a sibling or a parent or in writing in their journal or just on the page with their drawing.



Qui est dans ton arbre (tree)?

Matériaux:

- Papier blanc
- Marqueurs, crayons de couleur, pastels, crayon, peinture à eau

Procédure:

The student will produce an original family tree incorporating two each of both art principles and elements.

The student will then describe his family tree orally to a sibling or a parent or in writing in their journal or just on the page with their drawing.
